

^{*}Use <u>water-soluble topping</u> on fabric that can be machine washed. Embroidery topping is a specially crafted material that prevents embroidery stitches from sinking into absorbing types of fabric. When working with fabrics like terry cloth, knits, fleece, jersey, velvet, corduroy, artificial fur, and any fabric with a nap, the use of embroidery topping is essential for optimal results.



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
